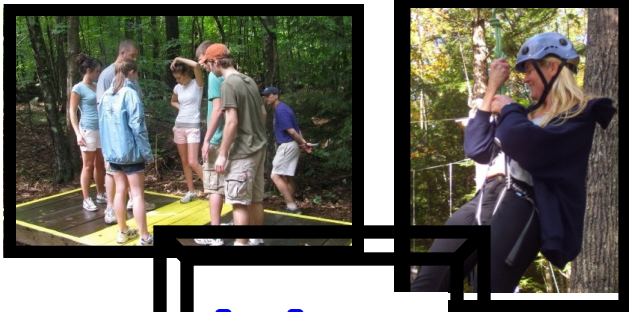


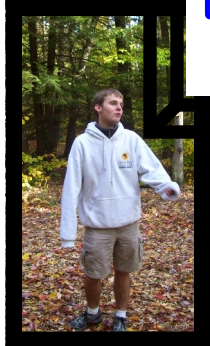
WHAT WILL WE DO IN SLP

ABOUT THE STUDENT LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The Student Leadership Program at Great Bay Community College has three primary objectives:

1. To provide students with an opportunity to develop soft skills that are needed to be successful in their lives;
2. To provide students with experiential learning opportunities that will allow them to utilize the skills they have learned in the leadership program and the classroom;
3. To get students connected to Great Bay Community College faculty, staff and fellow students.

HOW IT WORKS

1. Student picks up application in Student Life.
2. Student decides if they want to attend the overnight retreat in the fall or the day retreat in the spring.
3. Student drops off completed application to Student Life.
4. Student must complete the following by April 15
 - Attend Retreat
 - Complete 2 Experiential Learning activities
 - Attend 5 Student Engagement activities
 - Attend 5 Leadership workshops

AFTER I COMPLETE THE PROGRAM

1. Attend the Student Leadership Banquet on May 10 to receive your Certificate and award.
2. Apply to be a Student Trip Leader for the Freshman Outdoor Orientation Trips or the Student Leadership Retreats.
3. Apply to conduct or run a Student Leadership Workshop.
